GENERAL ORDER RE: IMPLEMENTATION OF EMERGENCY

RELIEF AUTHORIZED BY THE CHAIR OF THE JUDICIAL COUNCIL

EMERGENCY ORDER OF APRIL 23RD, 2021

WHEREAS the World Health Organization, The United States Centers for Disease Control and Prevention and the State of California Department of Public Health have recognized that the world, country, and state face a life-threatening pandemic caused by the COVID-19 virus.

WHEREAS as of April 23rd, 2021, the World Health Organization has reported 144,358,956 confirmed cases of COVID-19 worldwide with 3,066,113 deaths caused by the virus.

WHEREAS as of April 23rd, 2021 the Center for Disease Control has reported 31,730,950 confirmed cases of COVID-19 in 50 states and 4 territories of the United States of America, 567,352 of which have resulted in deaths.

WHEREAS as of April 23rd, 2021 the California Department of Public Health has reported 3,626,656 confirmed cases of the COVID-19 virus in the state of California causing 60,086 deaths.

1 **WHEREAS** as of April 23rd, 2021 the Kings County Department of Public Health has
2 reported 15,614 confirmed cases of the COVID-19 virus in the community with an
3 additional 7,207 cases in the State Prisons located in Kings County for a total of
4 22,821 positive COVID-19 cases in Kings County causing 246 deaths.

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6 **WHEREAS** the World Health organization, the Center for Disease Control, California
7 Department of Public Health, and the Kings County Department of Public Health
8 have all recommended social distancing practices of staying at least six feet apart
9 and the prohibition of gathering in groups as the best method to prevent the
10 contraction and spread of the COVID-19 virus.
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13 **WHEREAS** on March 4, 2020 California Governor Gavin Newsom declared a state
14 of emergency in California because of the COVID-19 virus.

17 **WHEREAS** on March 13, 2020 the President of the United States declared a
18 national emergency because of the COVID-19 virus.

20 **WHEREAS** on March 19, 2020 Governor Newsom issued Executive Order N-33-20,
21 requiring all residents of the State of California to stay home and shelter in place.
22

23 **WHEREAS** on March 23, 2020 the Chief Justice of the California Supreme Court
24 and Chair of the Judicial Council, the Honorable Tani G. Cantil-Sakauye, issued a
25 state-wide order recognizing the Courts in the State of California are ill –equipped to
26 effectively allow social distancing and other recommendations by public health
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1 experts required to protect people involved in court proceedings and to prevent the
2 spread of the COVID-19 virus.

3
4 **WHEREAS** on March 23, 2020 the Chief Justice of the California Supreme Court
5 and Chair of the Judicial Council, the Honorable Tani G. Cantil-Sakauye, issued a
6 statewide order suspending all jury trials for 60 days from the date of her order and
7 the time period for bringing a case to jury trial for 60 days from the date her order.
8

10 **WHEREAS** on March 27, 2020 Governor Newsom issued executive order N-38-20
11 suspending all legal authorities that impede the use of technology in court
12 proceedings and authorized the Chair of the Judicial Council to extend deadlines for
13 certain court proceedings until 90 days after the state of emergency related to
14 COVID-19 is lifted.
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17 **WHEREAS** in order to protect the health and safety of the public, court employees,
18 attorney's, litigants, judicial officers, law enforcement officers and the staff and
19 inmates in detention facilities, on March 30, 2020 the Chief Justice of the California
20 Supreme Court and Chair of the Judicial Council, the Honorable Tani G. Cantil-
21 Sakauye, issued a state wide emergency order authorizing trial courts to make
22 orders extending deadlines for certain court proceedings and for the use of
23 technology to conduct legal proceedings.
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26 **WHEREAS** On March 18, April 14, June 15, July 14, August 17, September 16
27 October 21, November 19th, December 17, 2020, January 21, 2021, February 18th,
28 2021, March 22nd, 2021 and April 22nd, 2021 The Honorable Tani G. Cantil-Sakauye,

1 Chief Justice of the California Supreme Court and Chair of the Judicial Council
2 determined that the conditions described in Government Code section 68115(a)
3 continue to exist in Kings County and therefore she authorized this Court to issue an
4 implementation order extending the deadline for jury trials.
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6 **WHEREAS** after balancing the Constitutional due process rights of parties in
7 criminal and civil cases with the health and safety of these parties, the public, court
8 staff, judicial officers, attorneys, witnesses, jurors, law enforcement officers, deputy
9 Sheriffs, probation officers and other persons present during court proceedings;
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
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12 **IT IS HEREBY ORDERED THAT:**

- 13 1. The time period provided in Penal Code section 1382 for the holding of a
14 criminal trial is extended by no more than 30 days from the last date on
15 which the statutory deadline otherwise would have expired. This order is
16 applicable only to cases in which the original or previously extended
17 statutory deadline otherwise would expire from April 27th, 2021, to May
18 27th, 2021 inclusive (Gov. Code section 68115(a)(10); Executive Order N-
19 38-20 (03-27-2020).
- 20 2. The time periods provided in sections 583.310 and 583.320 of the Code of
21 Civil Procedure to bring an action to trial are extended by not more than
22 30 days, applicable only to cases in which the deadline otherwise would
23 expire from April 27th, 2021, to May 27th, 2021 inclusive (Government
24 Code section 68115(a)(6)
- 25 3. These extensions are in addition to any relief provided pursuant to any
26 specific emergency order issued under a subdivision of Government Code
27 section 68115 related to any other extension or form of relief.
- 28 4. The Kings County Superior Court is to make use of available technology,
when possible, to conduct judicial proceedings and court operations
remotely.

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5. Any statute, local rule or California Rule of Court which would prevent the court from using technology to conduct judicial proceedings and court operations remotely are suspended.


THE JUDICIAL COUNCIL OF THE STATE OF CALIFORNIA

Because of the COVID-19 pandemic, leading to health and safety concerns resulting in substantial operational impediments, and the proclamations of states of emergency by federal, state, and local officials, it was determined on twelve prior occasions that the conditions described in Government Code section 68115 were met with regard to the Superior Court of California, County of Kings (Court). Based on those determinations, and pursuant to the Court's requests, corresponding emergency orders issued authorizing the Court to implement certain relief under Government Code section 68115. Upon the renewed request of Presiding Judge Robert Shane Burns, it now is determined that the conditions described in Government Code section 68115(a) continue to exist (Gov. Code, § 68115(c)), and it is ordered that the Court is authorized to do the following:

- Extend the time periods provided in sections 583.310 and 583.320 of the Code of Civil Procedure to bring an action to trial by not more than 30 days, applicable only to cases in which the deadline otherwise would expire from April 27, 2021, to May 27, 2021, inclusive (Gov. Code, § 68115(a)(6)); and
- Extend the time period provided in section 1382 of the Penal Code (section 1382) for the holding of a criminal trial by not more than 30 days, applicable only to cases in which the original or previously

extended statutory deadline otherwise would expire from April 27, 2021, to May 27, 2021, inclusive (Gov. Code, § 68115(a)(10)).*

* This authority supplements the authority to extend section 1382 deadlines granted to the Court in prior emergency orders. Accordingly, for any case in which the time to bring a defendant to trial previously was extended under one or more prior emergency order, and the extended deadline falls within the above-specified time period, this order authorizes the Court to extend the previously extended deadline by up to an additional 30 days. For any case in which the initial section 1382 deadline falls within the above-specified time period and is not governed by a prior emergency order, this order authorizes the Court to extend the time to bring a defendant to trial by a total of up to 30 days.
