STANDING ORDER AUTHORIZING PRESIDING JUDGE'S DESIGNEE[S] TO SIGN ORDERS PURSUANT TO CODE OF CIVIL PROCEDURE

SECTION 635, EXCEPT FOR JUVENILE AND FAMILY LAW STANDING ORDERS (SEE ORDERS

2019-09 AND 2019-11)

ALL INTERESTED PARTIES

California Code of Civil Procedure § 635 provides that in all cases where the decision of the Court has been entered into its minutes, and the judge who heard or tried the case is not available, the Presiding Judge may authorize another judicial officer to sign the formal judgment or order conforming to the minutes.

Accordingly, the Presiding Judge has determined that the following protocol will be observed to ensure that this Court's judges are authorized to sign orders and judgments regarding matters previously heard by judicial officers assigned to Superior Court Departments other than their own:

- a. The judicial officer presiding in Department 5 will be responsible for signing such documents in Department 6 should that judge be absent and that courtroom is dark.
- b. The judicial officer presiding in Department 6 will be responsible for signing such documents in Department 5 should that judge be absent and that courtroom is dark.
- c. In the absence of both judges in Departments 5 and 6, any other judge present at the Court is then authorized to sign applicable documents pursuant to CCP § 635.
- d. The judicial officer presiding in Department 7 will be responsible for signing such documents in Department 8 should that judge be absent and that courtroom is dark.
- e. The judicial officer presiding in Department 8 will be responsible for signing such documents in Department 7 should that judge be absent and that courtroom is dark.

- f. In the absence of both judges in Departments 7 and 8, any other judge present at the Court is then authorized to sign applicable documents pursuant to CCP § 635.
- g. The judicial officer presiding in Department 9 will be responsible for signing such documents in Department 10 should that judge be absent and that courtroom is dark.
- h. The judicial officer presiding in Department 10 will be responsible for signing such documents in Department 9 should that judge be absent and that courtroom is dark.
- In the absence of both judges in Departments 9 and 10, any other judge present at the Court is then authorized to sign applicable documents pursuant to CCP § 635.

Moreover, in the absence [or non-availability] of *any* current Superior Court of California, Kings County bench officer, the Presiding Judge may delegate CCP § 635 signing authority to a visiting judge participating in the Judicial Council's Assigned Judges Program.

Correspondingly, any Superior Court of California, Kings County bench officer, normally presiding in a specific department, is authorized to sign any order made by a visiting judge, assigned to that particular department, in absence of that visiting judge.
