ORDER RE: ALL PURPOSE ASSIGNMENT OF CRIMINAL

CASES

Misdemeanor criminal matters prosecuted in the name of the People of the State of California shall be assigned to one judge for all purposes, from arraignment through trial and judgment.

Felony criminal matters (including matters in which felony charges are combined with misdemeanor charges into one case) which are prosecuted in the name of the People of the State of California shall be assigned to one judge for all purposes, from arraignment on the Complaint through preliminary hearing and from arraignment on the Information through trial and judgment. The all-purpose assignment provided for herein will remain the same both before and after the arraignment on the Information.

Violations of probation, parole, mandatory supervision, or PRCS, shall be assigned to one judge for all purposes, from arraignment through hearing and judgment.

The all-purpose assignment of a case to a judicial officer does not change where, due to court congestion or other issue, a particular calendar or hearing in the case is held before another judicial officer.

For Misdemeanor criminal matters, the all-purpose assignment of a case occurs at the time of entry of initial plea to the Complaint. The all-purpose assignment of a Felony criminal matter occurs at the time of entry of initial plea to the Complaint or Information,

whichever occurs first. The all-purpose assignment of a violation of probation, parole, mandatory supervision, or PRCS, occurs at the time of entry of initial plea to the violation.

In any case where the assigned judicial officer is recused or disqualified, the case shall be reassigned pursuant to the Standing Order re: Reassignment of Cases Involving Disqualifications and Recusals currently on file with the court.

This Standing Order shall remain in effect until further order of the Court.
